NAWRS 2017 WHAT IS @LIKE?

- **Program was a Workforce Innovation Fund initiative**
- @LIKE was designed to:
 - employment, and community
 - through life coaching

Test strategies to reconnect young adults to educational opportunities,


Focus on socio-psychological elements of resiliency and self efficacy





NAWRS 2017 WHAT IS @LIKE?

- July 2012 October 2016
- U.S. DOL awarded contract for \$6m;contract began July 2012
- Program was in operation across three unique counties: Imperial, **Riverside, and San Bernardino**
- Served young adults ages 18 to 24 who were disconnected from work and school





NAWRS 2017 @LIKE FEATURES

- Ease of enrollment
 - One-Page Application and Self-Attestation
- Life Coaching versus only Case Management
- Help young adults learnt to be resilient and to find confidence
 - Use of Social/Psychological Assessments



NAWRS 2017 @LIKE FEATURES

- Increased the intensity of service as opposed to traditional programs (WIA/WIOA)
 - Through number of professionals delivering a 'wrap around' service
 - Through length of time in program
 - Through service options available
 - Through participant re-engagement.





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EVALUATION OVERVIEW Workforce Innovation Fund (WIF) requirement

- IMPAQ International: Independent evaluator
- Mixed-methods evaluation
- Quasi-experimental design
 - Propensity score matching
 - Comparison Group: young adults who participated in WIA/WIOA programs in the same counties at the same time.



 - Documents review


Program Recruitment

- Follow Multi-faceted Approach to Recruitment
- Streamline Program Enrollment and Engagement
- Participant Engagement
 - Employ Social/Psychological Assessments
 - Emphasize Professional Development
 - Flexibility to Re-engage


- Did @LIKE serve individuals with barriers?

- Was the program successful in meeting its goals?








Characteristics of Enrolled Participants








Perceived Barriers Test Results







Self-Efficacy Test Results










Self Appraisal Test Results







NAWRS 2017 OUTCOMES ANALYSIS: RESULTS

- Served 664 participants.
- High rates of program completion
 - 45.5 percent were deemed successful completers.
- tenure mattered more than demographic and socioeconomic variables, and were positively related to outcome achievement

Program-related variables such as number of services and program







NAWRS 2017 IMPACT ANALYSIS: RESEARCH QUESTIONS

- What is the impact of the program on participants' likelihood of finding employment or obtaining training?
- Is the program effective in improving educational achievement?
- Are @LIKE individuals more likely to complete program requirements successfully as compared to WIA/WIOA participants?



NAWRS 2017 COST-BENEFIT ANALYSIS

Did measured benefits of the @LIKE program exceed its measured costs?









NAWRS 2017 COST-BENEFIT ANALYSIS Program's net benefits amount to \$1,449, one year following

- program completion.
- Assumptions:
 - All costs are incurred during program implementation.
 - Benefits take time to accrue.
 - to lack of data to quantify benefits beyond that period.
 - Social discount rate of 3 percent.

NAWRS 2017 CONCLUSION

- Program achieved its major goals
 - positive outcomes
 - Even in the case of especially disadvantaged subgroups.
- Program significantly improved educational and employment outcomes
- @LIKE program exceed its measured costs
