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
# Examining Reentry...

- The state has been interested in understanding different facets surrounding foster care reentry.
  - Legislatively mandated report on foster care reentry

     Data analysis, Case reviews, survey and
     interviews with caseworkers;
  - Examining differences between children with prior child welfare experience vs first entries;
  - An examination of an expanded definition of reentry: child welfare or juvenile services;
  - A survival analysis assessing differences across permanency type and risks...



### Child Welfare/DJS Overlap





## **Dually Involved Youth**

- Multiple jurisdictions provide services for this population
- Similarly poor outcomes as CW youth
- Most studies look at these children separately (i.e., juvenile justice lens <u>OR</u> child welfare lens)



### Variables Examined

- Trying to understand the different categories of variables and the impact that they have on reentries.
- Child Variables
  - Demographics and behavior
- Family Variables
  - Family characteristics, child welfare history, juvenile services history
- Systemic Variables
  - Policy and timing related variables



#### **Child Level**

- Race
- Age
- Physical health
- Behavioral health

#### **Family Level**

- Substance abuse
- Reasons for removal
- Prior CPS involvement
- Poverty
- Prior experience

#### System Level

- Placement type
- Number of placements
- Time in care



### **Population Characteristics**

- Exits from Maryland State Supervised Child Welfare System to Reunification between July 1, 2008 and June 30, 2012
- 2,259 Children Exiting Care to Reunification during the period
- Standard definition of child welfare reentry (single system reentry)
  - 18% re-enter within 18 months
- Expanded definition of re-entry (multi-system re-entry)
  - 24% re-enter within 18 months



### Discussion

- Like prior child welfare experience, prior juvenile justice experience is predictive of reentry
- Both models have similar risks for reentry
- The multi-system perspective increased reentries over 18-months from 18% to 24% (a 33% increase in reentries)
  - Single-system examination of reentry is too conservative and does not adequately reflect the effectiveness of the reunification process



## Implications

- Continued focus on closely related systems
  - Not doing so misinforms on the adequacy of reunification efforts
- Risk and protective factors were also the same for re-entry
  - More practice research
    - Permanency in child welfare
    - Preparation for re-entry in juvenile justice
