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SNAP E&T Program

The purpose of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Employment and Training (E&T) Program is to help SNAP households gain skills, training, work, or experience that will increase self-sufficiency and reduce their reliance on SNAP benefits.



Louisiana SNAP E&T Program

There are two categories of SNAP E&T participants:

- mandatory participants and
- voluntary participants.

The State of Louisiana operates a mandatory and voluntary SNAP E&T program.



Louisiana SNAP E&T Program

DCFS utilizes contractual agreements with Louisiana Workforce Commission (LWC) and SNAP E&T contracted partners to meet the SNAP E&T requirements. Louisiana's SNAP E&T Program has three elements:

- Louisiana Job Employment Training (LaJET) Program,
- Louisiana Workforce Commission (LWC) Business and Career Solutions Centers, and
- Voluntary SNAP E&T Providers



Mandatory SNAP E&T Participation

Louisiana Jobs Employment and Training (LaJET)

Louisiana contracts with LWC to operate the LaJET Program in four parishes: Caddo, Orleans, Ouachita, and Rapides. DCFS sends referrals to LaJET for services.

LaJET offers Job Search Training and Job Search.



Mandatory SNAP E&T Participation

Able-Bodied Adults Without Dependents (ABAWDs) in Louisiana Workforce Commission

Louisiana currently has a federal ABAWD waiver that exempt ABAWDs from the SNAP time limit.

Louisiana partners with LWC to offer ABAWDs job skills assessments, training, and employment assistance through LWC's fifty-nine (59) Business and Career Solutions Centers. ABAWDs are MWRs ages 18 – 49 who are required to participate in E&T when referred to LWC Business and Career Solutions Center.

Voluntary SNAP E&T Program

 Louisiana has operated a small SNAP E&T program that was a mandatory program for many years, but began expanding in 2016.

 Our first voluntary partner was Liberty's Kitchen here in New Orleans.

 E&T Providers who partner with DCFS can receive up to 50% reimbursement for administrative costs. This enables providers to expand their services in their community.

 These providers can also receive up to 50% reimbursement for supportive services provided to SNAP participants.

 All Voluntary SNAP E&T Providers utilize reverse referrals. The provider recruits participants and provides a list of participants to DCFS each month.

 DCFS determines which participant receives SNAP benefits in order to provide funding for the provider to offer supportive services to SNAP participants.

 SNAP E&T Providers conduct an assessment with all potential participants.

- Intensive case management is provided to all participants. They use a holistic approach to ensure the success of their participants.
- Life skills are an essential part of any good SNAP E&T provider's program.

The provider determines which components to offer. They may provide one, two, or several components. These include but are not limited to:

- Job Search
- Job Search Training
- Education
- Work Experience
- Job Retention
